The Johnstown-Monroe Local School District is seeking qualified applicants for the position of Treasurer/CFO.

The District is located in Licking County, Ohio, one of the state's—and the Midwest's—fastest growing regions.

Our future is exciting. We are a vibrant, dynamic district, serving more than 1,700 students, with significant enrollment growth expected.

The new Treasurer/CFO is expected to assume responsibilities by August 1, 2023.

In 2022, the District launched an enhanced K-5 reading program. In 2023-24 we will implement a new K-12 Math series. Further curriculum refinements are being prepared.

Building student pathways

Johnstown-Monroe Local School District employs 129 highly qualified educators focused on providing exceptional instruction and meaningful educational experiences.

Utilizing research-based instructional strategies, as well as multiple tiers of intervention, our teachers ensure we are ready to meet the needs of our students.

The District concentrates on three pathways for our students we call, "The Three E's": "Enrollment, Employment" and "Enlistment."

A rigorous academic program culminates within our high school, where students have access to Advance Placement, Honors, and College Credit Plus Courses.

Approximately 93% of JHS students participate in athletics or school-sponsored activities.


Johnstown-Monroe offers 32 inter-scholastic athletic programs, as well as a growing, 180-member "Big Red Marching Band."

Intel, other companies to create educational, employment offerings



- One of the largest semiconductor plants on earth is expected to open within our district's footprint in 2025.
- Intel's \$20 billion investment will bring 3,000 jobs, and another 7,000 construction jobs.
- Intel's announced development represents the largest economic development in Ohio history.
- Dozens of other commercial and manufacturing companies required in support of Intel are also in the process of construction or land acquisition.
- Facebook, Google, Amazon, and Amgen are among the steadily growing number of enterprises located within minutes of our District.


Our Schools and Community

Located in northwest Licking County, Johnstown-Monroe Local Schools serve students from the City of Johnstown, Monroe, Liberty, and Jersey townships.

District residents cherish a small town, rural lifestyle, but are also preparing for transformative change and employment opportunities represented by Intel and other commercial developments.

Those changes are also tied to Johnstown's geographic location. Two major highways intersect Johnstown. It is a quick commute to Columbus, Newark, and John Glenn International Airport.

The voters of Johnstown have traditionally been very supportive of their schools. On May 2, 2023, the District successfully renewed two school levies by strong margins, assuring we will not have to return the ballot until at least 2028.



- A new elementary school was constructed on donated land and opened in September 2017.
- In January 2018, a new 85,000 square foot high school opened.
- With the assistance of donations, the District renovated a 30-year-old Performing Arts Center in 2019.
- A new stadium and turf project completed in 2019.
- Renovated existing building that reopened as JIS in 2022, without additional levy or bond issue.
- Renovated weight room in 2021, without additional levy or bond issue.
